Equitas hosts Montreal event for its 50th anniversary as Canada's oldest and most active human rights education organization

Thursday, March 23, 2016 – On March 29, 2017, Equitas will host its annual fundraising event in support of the organization's education and awareness programs for youth and human rights defenders in Canada and worldwide.

The event will take place at **Le Salon 1861, 550 Richmond Street in Montreal, from 6:30-10pm**.

This year, the event focuses on the themes of women's rights, inclusion and diversity, with guest speaker **Cathy Wong**, President of the Conseil des Montréalaises. The conversation will be moderated by *Le Devoir*'s **Francine Pelletier**.

"In preparing our event this year, we were inspired by the story of one of Equitas' co-founders in 1967, Quebec women's rights pioneer Thérèse Casgrain, who fought for the advancement of women's rights with courage and determination", says Equitas Executive Director Ian Hamilton. "It's 2017, yet women are still under-represented in leadership positions. We need to encourage diversity in our leadership models and promote equal opportunities today and tomorrow. From Thérèse Casgrain to our guests, Cathy Wong and Francine Pelletier, women are challenging inequality and are inspiring us to think about how to empower, support and engage young women."

Some previous guest speakers who have supported Equitas events include Lt. Gen. **Romeo Dallaire**, the Rt. Hon. **Paul Martin**, former National Chief of the Assembly of First Nations **Phil Fontaine**, Nobel Peace Prize Laureate Prof. **Muhammad Yunus**, and the Rt. Hon **Michaëlle Jean**.
