# Job Summary

Equitas - International Centre for Human Rights Education is looking for an intern in media and public relations. Under the supervision of the Communications Manager, this person's main tasks will be to provide assistance in media and public relations in the context of Equitas' 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

## Main responsibilities

- Participate in the promotion and coverage of events, impact stories and other projects related to the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary;
- Participate in the development of content and outreach strategies to motivate our target audiences and donors;
- Produce communications material, including multimedia (images, videos, etc.);
- Write articles and produce engaging publications on topics related to human rights and the impact of Equitas' projects;
- Search, identify and manage a list of contacts.

## Knowledge and skills

- Be enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate program in public relations, journalism, communications, marketing, political science, international relations or other related field;
- Excellent command of written French or English (or both);
- Ability to speak both official languages;
- Ability to work fast and manage several projects simultaneously;
- Knowledge in communications, especially in media and public relations;
- Basic knowledge of image-video editing (Photoshop or other);
- Basic knowledge of web site management, tools and trends in social networks;
- Great interest in international news and issues related to human rights in Canada and around the world.

The intern will work primarily at Equitas' office in Montreal, with the possibility of teleworking occasionally.
