# POST-EVENT REPORT

Youth, Power and the Pandemic Tuesday, April 27, 2021



On April 27, more than 200 participants attended the EquiTalks virtually to listen to Jayathma Wickramanayake, the UN Secretary General's Envoy for Youth and young panelists, discuss the important issues that youth all over the world have had to face during the pandemic and how they are redifining social change.

More specifically, they underlined the importance of paying attention to the **very different realities of youth**, while emphasizing **youth inclusion**, particularly when it comes to **actions and solutions** that would benefit them.

The EquiTalks created spaces for meaningful dialogue between youth activists, representatives of youth civil society organizations, and decision-makers, contributing to building more equitable communities.

A first at the EquiTalks, graphic recording gave attendees an opportunity to absorb content on a visual level. Percolab's graphic recorder and youth harvesters listened to key ideas brought up at the EquiTalks, synthesized them, and documented them in an artistic form.

The end results are a **visual and auditory maps of key insights** that can be reflected on by attendees after the event.
